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SING WARWICK 2107 on 11th February was a great success, with well over 80 people attending for a day's singing and playing at St Nicholas' Church, Warwick, where we explored newly found church music in the Warwickshire County Record Office. The following is a copy of the write-up by our Chairman, Sue Lanfear:

Sing Warwick 2017, run by Edwin and Sheila Macadam, and Immanuel's Ground (IGQ), was an all day workshop which took place on Saturday 11th February at St Nicholas', Warwick.

The church website describes St Nicholas as 'an unusually fine example of Gothic revival architecture' being built in 1785 to replace a medieval church built on the site of a Saxon nunnery. So we were in the heart of Warwick, opposite the gates of the castle in a very pretty church built right in the middle of our WG period. The church was built complete with a west gallery across the entire west end, albeit now housing the organ.

The workshop was billed as 'An Exploration of music contained in four Quire Books from Harborough Magna, and Warwick St Nicholas, now held by Warwickshire County Record Office.' Our composers for the day were William Beasley, John Hill, Joseph Key, Michael Dobney, John Alcock (jnr), John Valentine, Thomas Collins, and our old friend Unknown.

Although it was a dismal day, 85 folk in some cases from as far as the West Country and the East Coast, and including 22 instrumentalists, had braved the roads and the weather to come and make music. Set out on tables behind our conductor's stand were the books containing the originals of our music for the day, set out by, and on generous loan from, Warwickshire County Record Office. At their request these valuable books were justifiably guarded by Mrs Macadam against rough handling and photography.

As was demonstrated by the excellent turnout - including some 50 people new to West Gallery - there is tremendous enthusiasm for our kind of music, and the success of the day itself was the result of some painstaking research by our leaders.

In the past IGQ has held a couple of gigs at Brinklow, including our last Christmas concert, which were very much based on local composer William Beasley and other local singers and/or instrumentalists known to have been involved with church music of the time.

It was therefore quite a sobering thought that some of our material would have been used in St Nicholas, and most definitely in St John the Baptist, Brinklow, and that it was only now being heard again after a gap of 200 years.

Part of the reason for the workshop was to give WCRO (as well as IGQ and West Gallery Music Association) more publicity, and also to give WRCO financial help for conservation purposes in this time of imposed constraints on local authorities.

Thus to forge a link between a west gallery quire and a Record Office at a time when the latter's support is at least precarious, demonstrates the value of such a link, and for us to be able to turn their (in some cases tattered) manuscripts into live and vibrant sound on a day such as we enjoyed, adds purpose and perspective to our joint causes.

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!! RECRUITMENT !!

We are hoping to find additional singers and players to swell our numbers from amongst those who like coming to our events, either as singers or as instrumentalists (and, yes, string players can – and do – manage both simultaneously!)

As to instruments, we try to keep within the bounds set by historical records, namely strings and woodwind (including serpents, curtals and light brass etc., but not heavy Eb instruments which tend to overpower the others!) As to singers, all are very welcome whatever age or ability; much of the music can be learned by ear, although of course the ability to read music is an advantage.

We hope that some of you may be interested in learning more of what we do as a Quire. We practice most Wednesday evenings at Northgate Church, or Hall, in Warwick, from 8pm to about 10 pm. If you can phone 01926 492945 and speak to lan Meddoms beforehand, it would be helpful to know if extra copies of music are necessary!!
